Study Group on Future of Territorial Space and Regional Economics and Finance

Subject

This group is formed of young and mid-career researchers to investigate ideals for the structure of national territory going forward now that Japan is facing depopulation, a declining birthrate, and demographic aging. According to the "Grand Design of National Spatial Development toward 2050," 60% of the country's regions will lose half of their populations (and 20% will become completely depopulated); the structure of national territory is changing rapidly. Further, the changes to working patterns prompted by the COVID-19 pandemic have the potential to change the structure of cities as well, including shortening the distance between home and workplace. These changing environmental conditions have major implications for Japan's economy, society, and the government's policy response. While there is a body of research on changing demographics, fiscal policy, and social security, very little of this research is tied to the structure of national territory and spatial heterogeneity. This group therefore invites guest speakers who are experts in national land planning, macroeconomics, and other areas, and holds broadranging discussions to consider socioeconomic trends, such as demographic changes and income inequality, as well as optimal policies for national and local governments, while incorporating spatial factors, including the structure of national territory and cities.
