

Study Group on Modern and Contemporary History

Subject	The group studies modern and recent history to gain insights into contemporary politics.
Overview	There are many commonalities between current politics and society and the early Showa period in the lead up to WWII—including turmoil in party-based politics, urgency in international politics, and the rise of populist movements. Believing that detailed research on modern and recent history, centering on Japan’s Showa period, may provide insight into how to respond in the future, the group carries out studies with nonpartisan politicians and others under the leadership of Professor Kiyotada Tsutsui, a leading authority on modern Japanese history.
